Abridged Prescribing Information Diane-35[®]

Composition: 21 hormone-containing beige coated tablets. Each coated tablet contains 0.025 mg ethinyl estradiol, 2 mg cyproterone acetate. **Indication:** Androgen-dependent diseases in women such as acne, alopecia and hirsutism. **Dosage & Administration:** Diane-35 is to be taken regularly in order to achieve the therapeutic efficacy and the required contraceptive protection. Previously used hormonal contraception should be discontinued. The dose regimen of Diane-35 is similar to the usual regimen of most of the combined oral contraceptives. Tablets are to be taken in the order described on the package every day at about the same time with some liquid to swallow. One tablet is to be taken daily for 21 consecutive days.
