


Role and significance of Medical Social Service Officer (MSSO) in the Hospital Setting



The Medical Social Service Officer (MSSO) is an indispensable member of the 'Multi-professional Health Care Team' who creates a therapeutic network among the doctor, the patient, the family and the community.

WHO definition says that "Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity."

Therefore the ultimate goal of Medical Social Services is **Health** which has a **Psycho-social element** dominating the physical factors most of the time.

The professional competency of a MSSO is formed through a Post-Graduate Degree in Social Work which gives a rigorous training by study of Social Work Methodology, Medical & Psychiatric Social work, Psychology, Sociology, Human Resource Management, Statistics, Social Policy & Administration and Research Methodology in addition to the Concurrent Field-work, Dissertation and Block-placement in specialized Social-work agencies.

# Role of the MSSO in AIIMS:

- 1. Psycho-social & Economic assessment and Social diagnosis
- The MSSO helps the patient to get the benefits from different schemes for poor patients through the Psycho-social & Economic assessment of MSSO.
- **2.** Facilitating **free medicines & surgical items** through Hospital Administration for **in-patients** as per the **Consultations** received from various wards
- **3. Exemption of Hospital Levy charges** of BPL patients and indigent patients based on the **Socio-economic assessment**
- **4. Providing Railway concession facility** to outstation patients as per Government rules to ensure the regular follow-up
- 5. Providing accommodation facilities to outstation patients
- **6.** Facilitation of services available for **EWS (Economically Weaker Section)** patient in more than 40 notified private hospitals as per the High Court Order
- 7. Facilitation of Financial Assistance through PM Relief Fund, Health Minister Fund and Nation Illness Assistance Fund (NIAF)
- 8. Coordination and Psycho-social assessment for **Renal Authorization** in purview of **Human Act 1994**

# 9. Counseling services

 Counseling the patient and attendants empowering them towards physical, social, economical and mental rehabilitation

#### 10. Rehabilitation

- Rehabilitation of Unknown, without attendant, Destitute, Orphan patients through NGOs
- Coordinating the rehabilitation of Medico-Legal Cases through police department

## 11. Research and Training

- Imparting training to **NSS, BSW, MSW students** from different colleges across India

# 12. Health promotional and educational activities

 Disseminating Health-education and Health-awareness through IEC material and Health-camps (eg. Blood Donation Camp, AIDS Awareness Camp)

### 13. Planning & Administration

- Coordination with the Hospital Administration and various Departments to improve the patient welfare activities and create a more patient-friendly environment
- Managing various information and guidance services in the main hospital through **Part-time Social Guides**

### 14. Fund-raising and networking

- Coordinating and networking with various NGOs and Donors for patient welfare

### 15. Emergency care in Casualty

- Providing all Medical Social Services **round-o-clock** including **shifting and rehabili-tation** of patients, creating a smooth work-flow in the casualty
- **Special services** during Epidemics, Disasters and Natural Calamities for managing the patient care efficiently
