Facing this reality and supporting the World Disaster Reduction Campaign of WHO, whose theme for the year 2008-09 is "Hospitals Safe from Disasters: Reduce risk, protect health facilities, save lives," and WHO's initiative for Patient Safety, the Department of Hospital Administration, AIIMS, New Delhi is organizing a South Asian Conference & CME on Synergy in Healthcare (SASHCON-2008) from 3rd to 6th November, 2008 at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. The theme of the conference is "Planning and Designing of Specialty Healthcare Facilities" with focus on "Safe Hospitals" and "Patient Safety".

The main objectives of the Conference are:

- Deliberate on latest trends in planning and designing of healthcare facilities.
- Emphasizing the need for shift from multispecialty design to unispecialty center based approach to patient care in tertiary care settings.
- Attempt at providing "Solutions "through client centered approach.
- Hospitals for future issues and perspectives.
- Energy Management and Green Hospitals.
- Maintaining continuity of services in times of disaster "Hospitals Safe for Disasters".

- Need for Patient Safety Policy various aspects and initiatives.

The present Conference is being organized in collaboration with the World Health Organization and in association with The Indian Institute of Architects (NC) and School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi.

The Conference will provide a platform to the various stakeholders in the field of healthcare service delivery, deliberate upon the relevant issues and come out with optimal solutions to various pertinent issues. About 500 select experts are expected to participate in this conference, which includes Hospital promoters, Healthcare / Hospital policy makers, Medical professionals, representatives from Financial Institutions, Facility managers, Health and Hospital Administrators, Hospital planners and Project Consultants, Engineers, Architects, Equipment manufacturers and distributors and experts from the Construction industry.

Registration fee is Rs. 3,500/- per delegate for Indian nationals (Rs. 2,500/- per delegate for early birds upto 31.08.08) and Rs. 5,000/- for Spot registration. Fee for Foreign Nationals is 100 US Dollars or equivalent in INR, (for Early Birds 75 US Dollars & for Spot Registration 150 US Dollars).
