With the expansion of services a separate cadre was created and in 1991 cadre review was done and the posts increased to 24 and in 1997 the strength rose to 41. At present there are 50 sanctioned posts.

At the end, I welcome all the luminaries, speakers, contributors, delegates in this Seminar and again thank all my colleagues for their concerted effort put up for the successful organization of the Seminar.

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ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Social work is a profession with a wide objective to improve people's holistic life style with special focuses on to make them able to help themselves. *Social work professionals* assist people by helping them cope with and solve issues in their everyday lives, such as family and personal problems and dealing with relationships. Some social worker professionals help clients who face a disability, life-threatening disease, social problem, such as inadequate housing, unemployment, or substance abuse. Social worker professionals also assist families that have serious domestic conflicts, sometimes involving child or spousal abuse. Additionally, they may conduct research, advocate for improved services, or become involved in planning or policy development. Many social workers specialize in serving a particular population or work in a specific setting like a Trauma Center, Emergency Services or Organ Retrieval Banking Organization (ORBO). Health and Social work profession is interrelated. The first Medical Social Worker had been appointed in AlIMS in 1960 and now Medical Social Service Officer (MSSO) is a full-fledged cadre having 48 officers in the institute working for patient welfare in all the departments.

For a multidimensional and holistic treatment of patients admitted in AIIMS, *Medical Social Work professionals* provide psychosocial support to individuals, families or vulnerable populations so they can cope with chronic, acute & terminal illnesses. They also guide families or caregivers, counsel patients, provide financial assistance for treatment and help in planning for patients' needs after discharge from the hospitals. They work as liaison among the different stakeholders engage in patient's welfare in hospital. The main objectives of this seminar are as follows:

- To discuss the issues related to present work practices, emerging challenges, policy implementations, available health infrastructure, innovative approaches in current scenario and the prospect ways to deal with it.
- To provide a platform to share & discuss the innovative & evidence-based practices and create a blue-print for the future initiatives.

The conference will include research papers, case-studies, project reports and posters. In brief, each of the technical sessions will broadly examine the changing needs for a sustainable Social Work practice in hospital settings and defined specific role of social work professionals in different health settings. The thematic focus areas of the seminar are:
