chairperson also instructed the representative of the CBWTF, M/s Biotic Waste solutions Pvt Ltd that their staff have to be immunized with hepatitis B and TT without fail. The same should be provided in writing to the office of the Medical Superintendent and that payment would be withheld in case of non-compliance. It was informed by the representative of M/s Biotic Waste Solutions Pvt Ltd that around 21 staff have been immunised with Hep B vaccine. A register is being maintained for the same. It was desired that all the staff are immunized and the same may be put up to the Officer I/c, Sanitation and Housekeeping.

Action: M/s Biotic Waste Solutions Pvt Ltd.

4. Bar coding of waste bags

The new rules have also included the component of bar coding on all the waste bags. This issue was discussed and decided that although the rules ambiguously place the responsibility with the occupier and the operator, in case of AIIMS, since the bags are being procured by the same operator i.e. Biotic Waste Solutions, bar coding would be done by the operator. It was informed by Dr P Kumar that the operator had agreed to the same, but informed that it would be done in a phased manner. Action: Biotic Waste Solutions Pvt Ltd.

5. Website

It was clarified that DPCC and CPCB officials had informed that no separate BMW website was required if the institute already had an independent website. Therefore, it was decided that in AIIMS, a drop down box in an appropriate location within AIIMS website would be created after discussing with Computer Facility. The content of the website would be deliberated subsequently. Action: Computer Facility and Dr P Kumar.

6. Retention of records

The new rules mandate that all records need to be maintained for a period of five years. This would include annual reports, monthly reports, training reports, immunization records and accident reports. Of these, the rules mandate uploading of annual reports, monthly reports, training reports and immunization reports. The same would be complied with.

Action: CF, Dr P Kumar, Sanitation officers of all centres.

7. Transition from old to new rules

Procurement: It was informed that the appropriate coloured bags and bins already have been procured. The transition was subject to procurement of needle destroyers.

8. Needle destroyers

In view of the fact that all sharps have to be collected in puncture proof, leak proof, tamper proof containers, it was decided that the various options available in the market should be explored and decisions may be taken based on both cost and effectiveness. In this regard, it was informed by the Store Officer, Main hospital, that a presentation was
