On the 2<sup>nd</sup> day Operative workshop is planned with a variety of cases which will be performed by experienced faculty from India and abroad. The next two days are dedicated to debates and discussions with emphasis on evidence based management of complications. We have excellent speakers with most of them having a huge experience and publications in bariatric surgery. There will be a session on manuscript writing and paper publishing as well. In order to encourage presentation of high quality research work, we have made a provision for 20 bursaries for young surgeons in the form of stay at venue hotel and complimentary registration.

November is an excellent time to visit Delhi and weather is at its best with the onset of winter season. The venue of the main congress is Hotel Pride Plaza in the buzzing Aerocity, close to Airport. 

# Abstract Submission



### **Abstract Guidelines**

- ♦ The title of the abstract should be less than 30 words.
- The body of the abstract must be concise with less than 350 words. The abstract system will taccept abstracts that exceed 350 words (body of the abstract).
- The abstract must have following sections:
  - > Background/introduction
  - Objectives
  - Methods
  - Results
  - Conclusion
- ♦ There are three types of presentation available
  - Oral
  - Video
  - Poster
- Please note that selecting oral will not ensure your abstract is considered for oral presentation. Aresentation slots are limited and the abstract may be reallocated for poster presentation.
- Please ensure that you indicate the presenting author on the abstract. If the submitting allows also the presenting author then please markthis as the presenting author.
- → Tables must be attached into the body of the abstract a maximum of 2 can be submitted. Bnote that inserting tables will reduce your word capacity.
- Videos Please submit along with your VIDEO the textual abstract, following the Abstract Format instructions above. Maximum size of the video: 500MB. Acceptable video formats are: .mp4or.m4v
- Videos should be in a standardized format:
  - Videotitle
  - > Clinical presentation and indication for surgery
  - Preoperativex-ray images/endoscopy/blood results
  - Operative procedure
  - Postoperative outcome
- Videos must not exceed 10 minutes in length. Do not include authors or affiliation in the video or body of abstract.
- Careful proof reading and typing are essential, as otherwise the abstract may be amended rejected.
- Results reported using statements such as "results will be presented" or "data will be analysed" whot be accepted.
- Amaximum of 5 abstracts will be accepted per presenting author. Those who have already reached this number can only be listed as co-author.
- There are no limits of authors per abstract.
