## PLEASE NOTE:

- Segregation of patients, healthcare workers and support staff is vital:
  - Covid-19 vs non-Covid-19 areas
  - Within non-Covid-19 areas: Patients with respiratory symptoms vs without respiratory symptoms
- Improper use of N95 FFRs/Triple layer surgical masks/linen masks can INCREASE risk of infection (see 'Mask Management' below).
- Use of mask alone is NOT SUFFICIENT to prevent infection. HAND HYGIENE, COUGH ETIQUETTE AND SOCIAL DISTANCING are essential.
- Proper mask management, including extended use/reuse of N95 FFRs, will require SIGNIFICANT TRAINING of all concerned staff, and is heavily dependent on compliance of all concerned staff, especially with widespread resistance to the idea of reuse/reprocessing of N95 FFRs.

#### MASK MANAGEMENT: GENERAL MEASURES

- Perform hand hygiene before donning mask.
- DO NOT TOUCH OUTER SURFACE OF MASK. If inadvertently touched, perform hand hygiene immediately.
- When doffing/discarding mask, ONLY HANDLE THE STRAPS/TIES. Do not touch the mask or your face. Perform hand Hygiene.
- Discard used N95 FFR/surgical mask in red bin.

### 1. N95 FFR (filtering facepiece respirator) Management:

- Ensure proper fit and seal on donning.
- Single N95 FFR can be used for 8 hours, except in case of high-risk aerosol generating procedure or visible contamination (single use).
- Extended use = use of single N95 FFR without doffing, for more than 8 hours, for multiple encounters with several patients.
- Reuse = use of single N95 FFR, with repeated doffing and donning, for multiple encounters with several patients.
- As far as possible, minimize repeated donning/doffing of same N95 FFR. Minimize eating/drinking while wearing N95 FFR.
- If N95 FFR is reused, doff by handling straps/ties only. Place in clean paper bag/cardboard box. Perform hand hygiene. When required, remove from bag/box and don, by handling straps/ties only. Perform hand hygiene.

#### 2. Triple layer Surgical Mask Management:

- The available triple layer surgical masks are fluid resistant.
- Ensure proper fit of mask and minimal gaps between mask and face on all sides.
- Do not eat/drink while wearing mask.
- Single surgical mask may be used for 6-8 hours (if not damp or visibly contaminated). Do not eat/drink while wearing mask.
- Once mask is removed, do not reuse. Discard immediately.

#### 3. Linen Masks:

- Ensure proper fit of mask and minimal gaps between mask and face on all sides.
- Wash thoroughly with soap and water at the end of each day and dry in sunlight.
